I James Plunkett Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the Reign of His present Majesty King William the fourth Entitled "An Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Rathgogin (alias Charleville) in the County of Cork. —

Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition, for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is: Three hundred and twenty six pounds fifteen shillings and eleven pence Sterling by the year. of which sum of Three hundred and twenty six pounds, fifteen shillings and eleven pence, one hundred and two pounds, ten shillings and eleven pence Sterling are due and payable to the Earl of Cork and Orery, as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as owner of two third parts of the Tithe of that part of the Parish of Rathgogin (alias Charleville) which constitutes the townland of Rathgogin and which is commonly called the Improperiate part of the Parish of Rathgogin (alias Charleville). And Two hundred and twenty four pounds, four shillings, and eleven pence Sterling are due and payable to the Rev. William Dumm the Vicar of the said Parish; fifty one pounds, five shillings, and five pence of that sum being payable to him, as entitled to one third part of the Tithes of the townland of Rathgogin, and the further sum of One hundred and seventy two pounds, nineteen shillings and six pence, in that he is entitled to all Tithes whatever arising, growing, yielded or payable within all the other parts and portions of the Parish of Rathgogin (alias Charleville) save and except the townland of Rathgogin already mentioned. —

And I do further Certify that the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November. One thousand eight hundred and thirty is Forty two shillings and one halfpenny Sterling per Barrel.
