I John Stephens a commissioner duly appointed & sworn
under and by virtue of an act passed in the
2nd & 3rd Years of the reign of his present Majesty
King William the fourth entitled an Act
to amend three acts passed respectively in the
4th 5th & in the seventh & eighth years of the
reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth
providing for the establishing of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions
permanent") to ascertain and fix a true and
just Composition for all tithes arising growing
yielded or payable ^{within} out of the parish of
Ratholygan & County of Wicklow do certify
that the just & true amt of composition for all
tithes whatever within the said parish is
£ 203.. 4.. 4 Sterling by the year of which
sum of £ 203.. 4.. 4 one third part is
due and payable to His Honor in the diocese
of Osory as a composition for the Tithes
claimable by them as owners of the Vicarial
Tithes of said parish and the 2/3rd part is due
& payable to the Dean & Chapter of the Cathedral
Church of St Canice and are due as a composⁿ
for the Rectorial Tithes of said parish -
And I do further certify that the average
price of wheat being the Corn principally
grown within the said parish County for
the period of seven years ending 1st November
1830 is one pound twelve shillings & one halfpenny
Sterling
