

We John Perkins of Ballybroony and Thomas Palmer of Summerhill Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under & by virtue of the Act of the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true & just Composition for all Vicarial Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Rathrea in the County of Mayo Do hereby certify that a true and just Composition for all vicarial Tithes whatever within the said Parish for the twenty one Years next ensuing is Eighty Pounds British Sterling by the Year which said sum of Eighty Pounds British ~~Stg~~ is due and payable to the Reverend Joseph Verschoyle as Vicar of said Parish of Rathrea as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as owner of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish and we do farther certify that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven Years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1821 is fifteen Shillings two pence farthing of Barrell dated at Killalla this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1829 mine
