

I Edward Callison Commissioner duly appointed and sworn  
under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth Year of the Reign of King George  
the Fourth intituled An Act to provide for the Establishing of Composition for Tithes  
in Ireland for a limited time Chapter 99. And also by Virtue of an Act made in the  
Reign of William the Fourth, intituled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively  
in the Fourth, Fifth and in the seventh and eighth Years of the Reign of his late  
Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for  
Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent) To ascertain and  
fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or  
payable within the Parish of Rathreagh in the County of Mayo Do hereby certify  
that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes within the said Parish  
is One hundred and sixty Pounds Sterling by the Year of which Sum One hundred  
and sixty Pounds Sterling twenty one eightieth, being Forty two Pounds Sterling is due  
and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Thomas Sutton for the Tithes claimed by him as a Precentor  
of the Cathedral of Killalla and of the townlands of Ballybeg Carronkeel, Atheloy  
Creeces, Turmhill, Ronghane Kincun and Rathreagh and one sixty fourth being  
Two Pounds ten Shillings Sterling is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Archdeacon  
Kingsbury as Archdeacon of Killalla out of the townland of Ardenagur and  
seventy one three hundred and twentieths being Thirty five Pounds ten Shillings  
is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John O'Rourke as Lessee of the Vicars Choral  
of Christ Church, Dublin out of the townlands of Mooneen, Bealasoillogh  
Rathbane, Killeneerawagh, Ballygowan, Leharrowinlane, Court Hill Springhill  
Tonere and Clonconway all in the Parish of Rathreagh and one half being  
Eighty Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Archdeacon Verschoyle  
as Vicar out of all the above townlands

And I do further Certify that the Average Price of Oats being the Corn  
principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending on the first  
day of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty is twelve Shillings and  
eleven Pence half penny per Barrel Dated this 28 Day of October 1833
