

I Edward Patterson Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and
 by virtue of an act made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth
 intituled (An act to provide for the Establishing of Composition for tithes in Ireland for a
 limited time Chapter 99. And also by virtue of an act made in the Reign of William
 the Fourth intituled an act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth
 Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of his late Majesty King
 George the Fourth providing for the Establishing of Composition for tithes in
 Ireland and to make such Composition permanent,) To Ascertain and fix a
 true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing yielding or payable
 within the Parish of Rathrea in the County of Mayo, do hereby Certify that
 the true and just amount of Composition for all tithes within the said Parish
 is One Hundred and Sixty Pounds Sterling by the Year of which sum One
 Hundred and sixty pounds Twenty one Eightieths being Forty two pounds Sterling is
 due and payable to the Rev Thomas Sutton for the tithes claimed by him as Decreee
 of the Cathedral of St. Malia out of the Town lands of Ballylicy Carron Hill
 Atholoy Greener Farm hill Raughane Kineew and Rathrea and One Sixty parts
 being Two pounds ten Shillings is due and payable to the Rev. Archdeacon
 Kingsbury as Archdeacon of St. Malia out of the Town land of Adna fur and
 Seventy one Three Hundred and twentieths being Thirty five Pounds ten Shillings
 is due and payable to the Rev John Morke as Lessee of the Vicar Choral of Christy
 Church Dublin out of the Town lands of Monem Bredasullagh Rathrae
 Killeenoreough Ballygowan Lecharawintine Court Hill Spring Hill Tonerae
 and Cloonconway all in the above Parish of Rathrea and One half being Eighty
 Pounds Sterling is due and payable to the Rev Archdeacon Verschyle as Vicar
 out of all the above Town lands. And I do further Certify that the average
 price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of
 Seven Years ending on the first day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred and
 Thirty is Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence half penny & Morel Dated this
 25th Day of October 1833
