Certificate of Composition

We, Peter Roe and Thomas White Commissioners  
Duly appointed and sworn under and <sup>by</sup> virtue of  
an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of  
King George the Fourth, intituled an Act to provide  
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in  
Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a  
true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, grow-  
ing, yielded, or payable within the parish of  
Rathareen in the Queens County, do hereby Certify,  
that the true and just amount of Composition for all  
Tithes, whatever within the said Parish is. One  
hundred and thirty pounds, British Currency  
by the year —

And we do further Certify, that the average  
price of wheat, being the Corn principally  
grown in this County for the period of seven  
years ending on the 31 December 1821  
is Twenty Shillings per Barrel —
