

Certificate

I the Reverend John Wether D.D Incumbent of the Parish of Raymoghly having received from William Stewart Esq. Chief Landlord seized in fee of all that and those the lands of Montclink. exclusive of that part of it held from the Earl of Wicklow Chief Landlord, by James Marshall, commonly known by the name of Sallybrooke a notice in the words and Figures following -

Sir - You are hereby required to take notice that in pursuance of an Act passed in the 2^d and 3^d Years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively, in the 1st, 5th and in the 7th and 8th Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of composition of Tithes in Ireland, and to make such composition peremptory" I William Stewart of Stormhead, Chief Landlord seized in fee simple of all that and those the lands of Montclink the Meles and bounds whereof are as follows; that is to say bounded on the North by Sallybrooke, South by Drumnahel, East by Baldonagh and West by Tullybogly, situate in the Parish of Raymoghly and County of Donegal or being otherwise entitled according to the provisions of said Act to agree for and undertake the payment of Tithes lawfully payable for, and in respect of the said Lands, Do hereby signify to you my desire to agree for and undertake the payment of such composition as aforesaid, for and in respect of the said Lands, and thereby require you to grant me a Certificate in writing conformable to the provisions of the said Act, declaring me entitled to the benefit of this Notice, and to perform the other matters on your part required by the said Act to be done -
