We Henry Fleury and Gregory Lynbery Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth entitled an act to provide for the Establishing composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilmaclean in the County of Waterford and Diocese of Waterford. Do hereby certify that the true and just amt. of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is Two hundred and Nineteen Pounds ten shillings and one penny three farthings British Currency by the year of which sum of Two hundred and nineteen pounds ten shillings and one penny three farthings One hundred and fourteen pounds four shillings and ten pence halfpenny are due and payable to the Very Rev<sup>d</sup> and Hon<sup>ble</sup> Dean Bouske as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of the said Parish. And the sum of Seven Pounds three shillings & three pence farthing is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Cooke Jun<sup>r</sup> the vicar as owner of the vicarial Tithe of said parish and the sum of Twenty Nine pounds Two shillings is due and payable to George Ivis Esq<sup>r</sup> as a composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector Impropiator of the Rectorial and vicarial Tithes of the Town land of Ballygarrow. And We do further certify that the average price of Oats being the corn principally grown in such country for the period of seven years ending on the first of November 1821 is fourteen Shillings and one halfpenny per barrel.
