duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act  
made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the  
fourth intituled "An act to provide for the Establishing of  
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to  
ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all  
Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the  
Parish of Ringcurran in the County of Cork do hereby Certify  
that the true & just amount of Composition for all  
Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is four hundred  
and Sixty one pounds ten Shillings and nine pence  
farthing British Currency, of which sum of four  
hundred and Sixty one pounds ten Shillings and nine  
pence farthing the whole is due and payable to the Rev.  
Thomas Graves as a Composition for the Tithes claimable  
by him as Rector of the said Parish, and we do further  
Certify that the average price of oats being the corn  
principally grown in such County for the period of  
Seven years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1821 is  
fourteen Shillings British Currency per Barrel dated  
this 30<sup>th</sup> day of April 1828 -
