

We the Rev<sup>d</sup> Cecil Crompton and Geor<sup>g</sup>  
Mahon having been duly appointed and  
sworn under and by virtue of an Act made  
in the fourth year of the reign of King George  
the fourth entitled an Act to provide for  
the establishing of Compositions for tythes in  
Ireland for a limited time and ascertain  
to fix a true and just Compositions for all  
tythes growing yielded or payable within the  
parish of Kibini in the County of Mayo  
do certify that the true and just amount  
of Compositions for all tythes whatever  
within the said parish is One Hundred &  
Sixty pounds by the year the whole is due  
and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> John Gorges as a  
Composition for the tythes claimable by him as  
a Rector and Vicar of the said parish and we  
do further certify that the average price  
of oat, being the Corn principally grown  
in said County for the period of Seven years  
ending on the first day of November 1821  
is fifteen shillings and two pence farthing  
of a Bush according to the prices extracted from  
the Dublin Gazette - dated at Holywood  
the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1824
