

# Roach Parish Tythe Composition Certificate

I Owen Thomas Lloyd, having been duly appointed and sworn a Commissioner, under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third years of King William The Fourth, entitled an Act to amend Three Acts passed Respectively in the Fourth, and Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George The Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for all Tythes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent to ascertain and Fix, a true and just Composition for all Tythes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the said Parish of Roach, in the County of Louth, Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tythes, whatever, within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Forty Eight Pounds Eleven Shillings and Ten Pence Sterling by the year, which sum of Two Hundred and Forty Eight Pounds Eleven Shillings and Ten Pence Sterling, is due and payable to John Pratt Esquire, as a Composition for all Tythes claimable by him as Lay Impropriator of said Parish —

And I do further Certify That the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of seven years, ending on the Thirtieth day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty, is One Pound Twelve Shillings and one half penny Sterling per Barrel —
