

We the Rev. Richard Tomson and John Coates
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under an
Act in the fourth year of King George the fourth
entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited
time to ascertain a fair and just composition for
all Tithes arising growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Raddinstown in the Diocese
and County of Meath do hereby certify that the
true and just amount of composition for all Tithes
whatsoever within the said Parish is and lawfully
ought to be paid and lawfully should be paid
by the year which sum of £120 - British is due
and payable to the Rev. Donson by Goulds being
Rector of said Parish as a composition for the
Tithes claimable by him. And do further certify
that the average price of wheat being the corn
principally grown in such County for the period
of seven years ending on the 1st of November
1725 is one pound Eighteen Shillings and
eight pence the bush.
