 duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an  
 Act made in the fourth Year of the Reign of King  
 George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the  
 Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for  
 a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and  
 just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, <sup>Gilted,</sup>  
 or payable within the Parish of Rosconnell in the  
 Counties of Kilkenny and Queens County, do  
 hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of  
 Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said  
 Parish is One Hundred and forty three Pounds  
one Shilling and Six pence halppenny British by  
 the Year, of which Sum of One Hundred and forty  
three Pounds one Shilling and Six pence halppenny  
 British the Entire is due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup>  
Thos<sup>r</sup> Kearney, as a Composition for the Tithe  
 claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said  
 Parish. And we do further Certify, that  
 the Average price of Wheat, being the Corn principally  
 grown in the County of Kilkenny, for the period of seven  
 years ending on the first day of November 1821 was  
 is One Pound fifteen Shillings and Eight pence  
three fourths British per Barrel, and that the  
 average price of Oats being the Corn principally  
 grown in the Queens County, for the period of  
 Seven
