(~~Supplement~~) Certificate of Composition

The ~~same~~ Messrs of Mill-Lark in the County of Lifford  
Esquire and the Rev. William Baker Esq. of Lisburn in the Kings  
County Clerk, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and  
by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign  
of King George the Fourth, intitled an Act to provide for  
the Establishing of Compositions for the Tithes in Ireland for  
a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just  
composition for all Tithes arising growing or payable  
within the Parish of Roseau situate in the County of  
Lifford and Kings County, do hereby certify that a Special  
Meeting for said Parish duly qualified and assembled as  
directed by said Act did on Friday the 31<sup>st</sup> day of October  
1823 agree to and with the Rev. Thomas L'Estrange Clerk  
Rector and Vicar of the said Parish of Roseau, that he  
the Rev. Thomas L'Estrange should receive the annual  
fixed sum of Five Hundred and Twenty five Pounds  
Sterling as the amount of the Composition to be paid  
to him for all Tithes in the said Parish of Roseau,  
and that the said sum is not below the average  
amount of the sums actually paid out of and upon  
the said Parish of Roseau for all the Tithes thereof  
for the seven years next preceding the 1<sup>st</sup> day of  
November 1821: and that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the  
said Parish of Roseau is Five Hundred and Twenty  
five Pounds agreed upon as aforesaid by the year,  
the whole of which sum of Five Hundred and Twenty  
five Pounds is due and payable to the said Rev.  
Thomas L'Estrange as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish  
of Roseau.
