

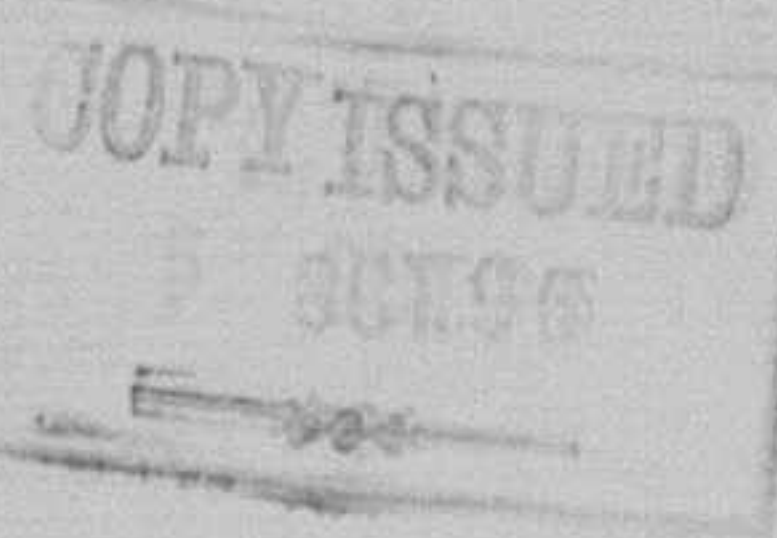
Certificate of Composition

I Edmund Homan Commissioner duly appointed and sworn
under and by Virtue of an Act made in the 2nd and 3rd William
4th Chap 99 entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively
in the 5th 5th and in the 7th and 8th years of the reign of his
late Majesty King George the 4th providing for the establishing
of Composition for Tithes in Ireland and to ascertain and fix
a true and just composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded
or payable within the Parish of Rosinure in the Counties of Leitrim
and Mayo do hereby certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish as
has been fixed by special agreement is Four Hundred and Fifty
Pounds Sterl. by the year - of which sum of Four Hundred and
Fifty Pounds One Hundred and Seventy Pounds (or the $\frac{17}{25}$ part) are
due and payable to the Rev^d James Lowry Dickson as a composition
for all Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of said Parish -
One Hundred and Forty Pounds (or the $\frac{14}{25}$ part) is due or payable
to Terence Conolly Esq^r on the part of Robert Johnston Esq^r who
holds under the Right Rev^d the Lord Bishop of the Diocese of
Kilmore Vicar of said Parish - and to the aforesaid Terence
Conolly on the part of Queen Wynne Esq^r lay impropriator of
said Parish the sum of One Hundred and Forty Pounds (or the
 $\frac{14}{25}$ part) and I do further certify that the average price of
Oats being the Corn principally grown in such Counties for
the Period of seven years ending on the 1st day of November 1830 being
is Thirteen Shillings and three pence three farthings 70
Barnes
