

I Thomas Gaggiu, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the Fourth, entitled "An Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland; and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Roskeen in the County of Cork, do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish, is ~~Eighty seven Pounds ten Shillings and three Pence halfpenny~~ ^{Eighty seven Pounds ten Shillings and three Pence halfpenny} by the Year - of which sum ~~the moiety amounting to Forty three Pounds fifteen Shillings and three Pence halfpenny~~ ^{the moiety amounting to Forty three Pounds fifteen Shillings and three Pence halfpenny} is due and payable by the Year to the Reverend Benjamin Burton Johnson as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of the said Parish - and the other moiety amounting to ~~Forty three Pounds fifteen Shillings and three Pence halfpenny~~ ^{Forty three Pounds fifteen Shillings and three Pence halfpenny} is due and payable by the Year to the said Reverend Benjamin Burton Johnson as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as ~~Deputy~~ ^{Deputy} to Robert William Phair Esquire, Lay Impropriator of the said Parish -

And I do further Certify, that the Average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven Years ending on the first day of November 1830 is Twelve Shillings and Eleven pence halfpenny per Barrel
