Saint Canice in the Diocese of Ossory.

We John Wood of Porterton in the County
of Kilkenny and Joseph Loughman of the City of Kilkenny
Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under
and by statute of Parliament made in the Fourth Year of the Reign
of King George the Fourth, Entituled "An Act to provide for
the Establishment of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a
limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish
of Saint Canice in the Diocese of Ossory and County of the City of
Kilkenny do hereby certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is
four hundred and six pounds Eleven Shillings and eight
pence British by the year for the Term of Twenty One years from
the date hereof is due and payable to the Vicars Choral of the
Cathedral of Saint Canice or their Lessee as a Composition for the
Tithes claimable by them as Owners of the Tithes of said Parish.

And We do further certify that the average
price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in the County of
the City of Kilkenny for the period of Seven years ending the first day
of November One thousand Eight hundred and twenty One
is One pound Eighteen Shillings and Eight pence halfpenny
per Barrel late Irish Currency -
