

*Certificate of Composition, for all Tithes, in the  
Union of the Parishes of Saint Canice and Ballybur  
in the Diocese of Ossory.*

*We, John Wood, of Semerton, in the County  
of Kilkenny, and Joseph Loughnan, of the City of Kilkenny,  
Esquires, Commissioners, duly appointed and sworn, under  
and by virtue of an Act, made in the fourth year of the reign  
of King George, the Fourth, entitled, "An Act to provide for  
the Establishment of Composition for Tithes, in Ireland,  
for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition, for all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable,  
within the union of the Parishes of Saint Canice and Ballybur,  
in the Diocese of Ossory, and County and County of the City  
of Kilkenny, do hereby certify, that the true and just amount  
of Composition, for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parishes  
is Four hundred and fifty pounds British, by the year, for  
the Term of Twenty One years, from the date hereof, is due  
and payable to the Vicars Choral, of the Cathedral of Saint  
Canice, or their Heirs, as a Composition, for the Tithes claimed  
by them, as Owners of the Tithes, of said Parishes.*

*And we do further certify, that the average  
price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in the County  
and County of the City of Kilkenny, for the period of seven years  
ending the first day of November, One thousand, Eight hundred  
and Twenty one, is One pound, Eighteen Shillings and Six  
pence halfpenny, per Barrel, late Irish Currency.*
