

I Frederick William Greene Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and
third Years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth intituled
"An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth,
and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King
George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain
and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing
yielded or payable within the Parish of St. Finbarr in the County of
the Liberties of the City of Cork, and in the County of Cork - Do hereby Certify
that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes, whatever
within the said Parish, is Nine Hundred and Ninety pounds Sterling
by the Year: of which sum of Nine Hundred and Ninety pounds
Six Hundred and fifteen pounds Thirteen Shillings and
Four pence, are due and payable to the Dean & Chapter of the
Cathedral, Cork, as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by
them as Owners of the Rectorial Tithes of that part of the said
Parish which is situate in the County of the Liberties of the City
of Cork; and Three Hundred and Eight pounds Six Shillings
and eight pence is due and payable to the Vicars Choral of the Cathedral
Cork as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by them as Owners
of the Vicarial and Appropriate Tithes of that part of the said
Parish which is ^{situate} in the County of the Liberties of the City of Cork, as aforesaid; and Sixty Five pounds are due and payable to the Dean
& Chapter of the Cathedral Cork, as a Composition for the Tithes
claimable by them as Owners of the Rectorial and Vicarial Tithes
of that part of the said Parish which is situate in the County
of Cork, namely, Milane and Killumney). — F.W.G.

And I do further Certify that the average price
of Wheat being the corn principally grown in said Liberties and County
for the period of Seven Years ending on the First day of November 1830
thirty is One Pound Twelve Shillings and one halfpenny per Barrel,
as published in the Dublin Gazette. —
