

I Frederick William Groves Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and
Third years of the reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth
intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in
"the Fourth Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the
"Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth providing
"for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and
"to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix
a true and just Ten position for such Tithes arising from any glebe or
parish within the Parish of St. Finbarr in the County of the
Liberties of the City of Cork, and in the County of Cork, Do hereby
Certify that the true and just amount of composition for all
Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is Nine Hundred
and Ninety pounds Sterling by the year of which sum of
Nine hundred and Ninety pounds Six hundred and
sixty pounds Thirteen shillings and three pence are due
and payable to the Vicar of the Cathedral Church, as a
composition for the Tithes claimable by them as Owners of the
Vicarial Tithes of that part of the said Parish which is situate
in the County of the Liberties of the City of Cork, and Three hundred
and Eight pounds six shillings and eight pence are due and payable
to the Vicar Moral of the Cathedral Church, as a composition for the Tithes
claimable by them as Owners of the Vicarial and appropriate Tithes
of that part of the said Parish which is situate in the County of
the Liberties of the City of Cork, as aforesaid; and sixty five pounds
are due and payable to the Dean Chapter of the Cathedral Church, as
a composition for the Tithes claimable by them as Owners of the Rectorial
and Vicarial Tithes of that part of the said Parish which is situate
in the County of Cork, namely, Melane and Killcumney.

And I do further Certify that the average
price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such Liberties and
County for the period of seven years ending on the first day
of November 1830 Thirty is One pound Twelve shillings and
one half penny per Barrel - as published in the Dublin Gazette
