Esq<sup>s</sup> Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under  
and by Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of  
the Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act  
to provide for the Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in  
Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable  
within that part of the Parish of Saint George in the Diocese and  
County of Dublin adjoining the Parish of Glasnevin being part of  
the Estate as far as respects the Tithe thereof of the Precentor and  
Chancellor of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity Dublin, Do  
hereby Certify, that the true and just Amount of Composition for  
all Tithes within the said part of the said Parish of Saint George  
is Twenty Three Pounds Sterling by the Year, of which sum of Twenty  
Three Pounds, one moiety, is due and payable to the Reverend William  
Robinson A.M. as Precentor of the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity  
Dublin, and one moiety, is due and payable to the Reverend Stewart  
Segar French Esq. as Chancellor of the said Cathedral Church, as a  
Composition for the Tithe claimable by them as Owners of the Tithe  
great and small of the said part of said Parish of Saint George.

— And We do further Certify, that the Average price of Wheat  
being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period of Seven  
Years, ending on the First day of November 1821, according to a Schedule  
thereof furnished by the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> Henry Goulburn Chief Sec<sup>y</sup> to the  
Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, is one Pound Eighteen Shillings and Eight  
pence halfpenny late Currency or one Pound Fifteen Shillings and Eight  
pence Three farthings British per Barrel.
