Reign of King Geo. 4th Ch. 99 entitled "An Act to provide for the
establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited
time" To Ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all
Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of St.
James' in the County of Dublin. Do hereby Certify that the amount
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is
Two hundred and fifty pounds Sterling by the year as agreed to
by and between the Rev^d Thomas Knignton Vicar of the Parish
of St. James' in the Diocese of Dublin and County of Dublin
with the Consent of His Grace the Archbishop of Dublin and the
Rt Hon. the Earl of Meath Patron and a Special Vestry duly
held for said Parish on 4th Feby. 1829 pursuant to the provision
of said Statute. Of which sum of Two hundred and fifty
pounds Sterling the whole is due and payable to the Rev^d
Thomas Knignton as a Composition for all the Tithes claimed
by him as Vicar of the said Parish.

And we do further Certify that the Average price of Wheat
being the Corn principally grown in said County for the
period of seven years ending on or next preceding the first day
of November One thousand eight hundred and Twenty One
is One pound eighteen Shillings and eight pence halfpenny
