

Certificate of Composition for the Tithes in the
Parish of Saint Johns in the Diocese of Ossory.

We Christopher Humphrey of the City of Kilkenny Esquire and John Wood
of Sowerston in the County of Kilkenny Esquires Commissioners duly appointed
and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the
reign of King George the Fourth entitled "An Act to provide for the
establishment of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to

ascertain and fix a true and just composition for the Tithes arising,
growing or to be payable within the Parish of Saint Johns in the
Diocese of Ossory and County of the City of Kilkenny. Do hereby
Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for the Tithes
whatevver within the said Parish is Five hundred and seventy six
pounds two shillings by the year of which sum of Five hundred and
seventy six pounds two shillings. Three hundred and seventy
three pounds and six pence is due and payable to the Mayor and Citizens
of the City of Kilkenny as their share of a Composition for the Tithes claimable
by him or them as owner or owners of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish

And that the sum of Two hundred and three pounds one shilling
and six pence is due and payable to the Rev Robert Shaw as a Compo-
sition for the Tithes claimable by him as owner of the Vicarial Tithes
of said Parish, And we do further Certify that the average price
of Wheat being the Corn principally growing in the County of the City
of Kilkenny for the period of seven years ending the first day of November
1821 is One Pound Eighteen Shillings and Eight pence half penny
per Barrel. late Irish Currency
