

2nd & 3rd William 4th Chap 119

I Philip Francis Droughtt Commissioner, duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the fourth. Chap 119, entitled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent; to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or payable, within the Parish of Saint Lawrence, County of Limerick, and Diocese of Limerick, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is twenty five pounds Sterling by the year, which sum of twenty five pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Henry Leproy as a composition for all Tithes claimed by him as Rector of said Parish.

And I do further certify that the average price of Wheat being the corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending the first day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty, is one pound ten shillings and three pence half penny per barrel of twenty Stone, Given under my hand this twenty eighth day of October one thousand and thirty three.
