A Commissioner Under and by virtue of an Act made in the  
Second and third years of the Reign of his Majesty King William  
the fourth to examine and make permanent three acts made  
in the seventh and eighth years of his late Majesty King  
George the fourth providing for the establishing composition  
for tithes in Ireland) to ascertain and fix a true and  
just composition for all tithes arising growing falling or  
payable within the Parish of St Margarets in the County  
of Westmeath and in the Diocese of Meath I do further certify  
that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes  
whatever in said Parish is forty eight pounds one shilling  
and nine pence Sterling by the year According to the average  
of the seven years preceding November eighteen hundred  
and thirty one due and payable as follows Viz - the sum  
of thirty two pounds fifteen shillings and ten pence Sterling  
To the Reverend Charles R Ellington DD as a composition  
for the tithes claimed by him as Vicar of said Parish and  
the sum of fifteen pounds five shillings and eleven pence  
Sterling To The Right Hon<sup>l</sup> The Earl of Portsmouth  
as a composition for the tithes claimed by him  
As day Impropriator of said parish And I do further certify that  
the average price of Corn (as taken from the Dublin  
Gazette) for the seven years preceding November  
eighteen hundred and thirty is as follows Viz -  
~~One pound twelve shillings and one halfpenny~~  
~~Shillings~~ And One twelve Shillings and eleven  
pence halfpenny Sterling per barrel being the  
price of all grain in the country Given under my hand this  
first day of July eighteen hundred and thirty three
