(and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the 4<sup>th</sup> year of the Reign of King  
George the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of Composition  
for tithes in Ireland for a limited time as also by Virtue of an Act made in  
the 5<sup>th</sup> year of the Reign of King George the 4<sup>th</sup> entitled an Act to amend an  
Act of the last Session of Parliament for providing for the establishing  
of Composition for tithes. As also by Virtue of an Act passed in the Seventh  
& Eight years of the Reign of his present Majesty entitled an Act to amend  
the Acts for establishing of Composition for tithes in Ireland. to ascertain  
and fix a true and just Composition for all tithes arising growing payable  
or payable with the Parish of Saint Johns in the County of Wicklow

Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition  
for all tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is One Hundred Twenty  
Seven Pound ten Shillings by the year of which sum of One Hundred  
and Twenty Seven Pound ten Shillings Two Third or Eighty five Pounds is  
due and payable to the Lay Tithe proprietors as a composition for the  
Tithes claimable by them and One Third or Forty two Pounds ten Shillings  
is due and payable to the Very Rev John French Dean of Elphin as  
a Composition for the tithe claimable by him as Rector of said Parish  
to be continued invariable for Twenty one years. And we do further  
Certify that the average price of Wheat being the Crop principally grown  
in such County for the period of Seven years ending on the first day  
of November 1821 is Sixty Shillings per Barrel
