

We Stephen Longworth and John Bruce Commissioners duly
Appointed and sworn under and virtue of an act made
in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth
intituled "An act to provide for the settling of Com-
positions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to
ascertain and fix a true and just composition for
all tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within
the Parish of Athlone in the County of Westmeath.

Do hereby certify that the true and just amount
of composition for all tithes due within the said
Parish of Athlone is 330^l pounds by the year. The
Whole of which sum of 330^l pounds is due and payable
to the Rev. James Robt. Moffatt as Rector and Incor of
said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average price of
oats being the corn principally grown in said County
for the period of seven years ending on the first day of
November 1821 was 15.2^d shillings for the barrel.

We have added the sum of thirty pounds to the sum of three
hundred pounds agreed to be received by the Rev. James Robt.
Moffatt from the Parish of Athlone as a composition for all tithes
in said Parish, because we have ascertained on the oath of several
persons connected with the tithes of the Parish, that the sum of three
hundred pounds so agreed on was below the average amount of the several
sums actually paid during seven years preceding 1821 for the tithes of said
Parish by the sum of thirty pounds which we have added.
