

We Stephen Longworth and John Bruce Commissioners, duly
appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act
made in the fourth year of the Reign of King
George the fourth Intituled an act to provide
for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a
true and just Composition for all Tithes arising
nowing yielded or payable within the parish
of Arkeane in the County of Westmeath, Do
hereby Certify that the true and just amount
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within
the said Parish of Arkeane is £330 Pounds per
the year, the whole of which sum of 330
Pounds is due and payable to the Rev James
Robt Moffatt as Rector & Vicar of said Parish
and we do further Certify that the average
Price of Acks being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of Seven
Years ending on the first day of November
1821 was 15 Shillings 2/4 of the Barrell

We have added the sum of thirty pounds
to the sum of three hundred pounds agreed to be
received by the Rev James Robt Moffatt from
the Parish of Arkeane as a Composition for
all Tithes in said Parish because we have
ascertained on the Oath of several persons
connected with the Tithes of the parish that the
sum of three hundred pounds so agreed on was
below the average amount of the several
sums actually paid during seven years
