

Certificate of Composition for all tithes in the Parish of St. Maul Diocese of Exeter and City of Exeter

We John Wood of Somerton in the County of Wiltshire and Joseph Loughman of the City of Exeter Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intitled "An Act to provide for the establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing added is payable within the Parish of St. Maul in the Diocese of Exeter and County of the City of Exeter do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is fifty pounds Sterling by the year which sum is due and payable to Robert Lord Bishop of Exeter as a composition for the tithes claimable by him out of said parish.

And we do further certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in the County of the City of Exeter for the period of seven years ending the first day of November 1831 is one pound eighteen Shillings and eight pence half penny of weight.
