true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes
whateve within the said Parish is Two Hundred and
forty seven pounds ten Shillings and Eight pence by
the year of which sum Seventy one pounds six Shillings
and Eleven pence by being the Rectorial Tithes is due
and payable to Com. Coldough Esq. as a composition
for all Tithes claimable by him as Lay impropriator
and that the sum of One Hundred and twenty six
pounds eight Shillings and nine pence by being
Vicarial Tithes is due and payable to the Rev^d
Richard Madeliff as Vicar of said Parish
And I do further Certify that the average price
of Cots being the Com principally grown in said County
for the Period of Seven years ending on the 1st Day of
November 1830 is per Barrel twelve Shillings and Eleven
pence Half penny
