appointed and sworn, under and by Virtue of an Act made in
the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth, intituled
"An Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time" do hereby certify that

Compositions for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of St. Michael in the County of the City of
Limerick, do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount
of Compositions for all Tithes ^{by value} within the said Parish is
Ninety Pounds by the year: Which sum of Ninety Pounds is
due and payable to the Rev. William May Marmath, Archdeacon
of Limerick; as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him
as Rector of the said Parish.

And we do further Certify that the average price
of Tithes being the Corn principally grown in such County
for the period of seven years ending the first day of November
1821. is fourteen Shillings and two pence farthing per Barrel.
