

I William Figgis Commissioner duly appointed, and sworn  
under, by virtue of, an Act made in the second, and third  
years of the Reign of King William the fourth, entitled an Act  
to amend three Acts, pass'd respectively in the Fourth, Fifth,  
seventh, and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty, King  
George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Composition for  
Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent,  
and to ascertain, and fix a true, and just Composition for all  
Tithes arising, growing, yielding, or payable within the Parish  
of St. Patricks in the County of Kilkenny, do hereby Certify that  
the true, and just amount of Composition for all Tithes what-  
-ever within the said Parish is Five Hundred Pounds, Sterling,  
by the year, which sum of Five Hundred Pounds, Sterling is  
due, and payable to the Very Rev<sup>d</sup> Dean of Ossory, the Rector,  
and Vicar, of the said Parish as a composition for the Tithes  
claimable by him as such Rector, and Vicar, And I do  
further Certify that the average price of Wheat, being the Corn  
principally grown in such County for the period of Seven Years,  
ending on the first day of November One Thousand, Eight Hundred,  
and Thirty, is One Pound, Twelve Shillings, and one Halfpenny  
per barrel,
