Whilly Stokes as a Composition for the Tethes claimed by him as Vicar of Said Parish, And The Sum of Theitymine Bounds One Shelling and Mine pence halfpenny To The Might Hon The Carl of Dotsmouth as a Composition for the Sittles claimed by him as Lay Impropriator of Suid Barish

And I do further certify that the average price of Corn (as taken from the Dublin Gazette) for the seven years preceding November, 1830, is as follow, viz.:— Oats 12s. 11;d. sterling, per barrel, being the crope principally grown in this county. Given under my hand this 7th day of September 1883.
