

Parish of St. Nicholas. Diocese of Cork & County, of Cork.

I John Kidd, Commissioner, duly appointed & sworn, under and by virtue of an Act, made in the second & third years of the Reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth, Intituled "An Act to Amend three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh and Eighth years of the Reign of his Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions permanent" - to ascertain & fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Saint Nicholas in the Diocese of Cork and County of Cork, Do hereby Certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all ^{the} ~~the~~ Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is One Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, fourteen Shillings and Ten Pence by the year; of which Sum of One Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, fourteen Shillings and Ten Pence, the Sum of Fifty Seven Pounds, fourteen Shillings is due & payable to the Rev. John Newman Lombard as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Rector of said Parish; of said sum of One Hundred & Sixty five Pounds, fourteen Shillings and Ten Pence, the Sum of Sixty two Pounds four Shillings and nine Pence is due and payable to Messrs John and Robert Meade for and during the term of Forty years from the 23rd of July 1819 (nineteen) under and by virtue of a Lease, unto them granted by the Lord Bishop of Cork, who is, by Royal Patent, Trustee of the Amount of said Tithes for certain purposes specified in said Royal Patent. The said sum of Sixty two Pounds four Shillings and nine Pence being the Amount of Composition for Tithe growing, yielded and payable out of that part of the Parish of St. Nicholas formerly known as St. John of Jerusalem. Of the above sum of One Hundred and Sixty five Pounds, fourteen Shillings & Ten Pence, the sum of Forty Pounds, sixteen Shillings and Four Pence is due and payable to the Lessees of the "Mayer and Aldermen of the Staple" in the City of Cork, under and by virtue of Leases, unto ~~the~~ Lessees granted in perpetuity by said Corporation as Trustees of Baron Worth's Charities, said Leases being dated in 1708. The remainder of the aforesaid Sum of One Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, fourteen Shillings and Ten Pence, that is to say, the Sum of Four Pounds, nineteen Shillings and nine Pence is the property of Mr. Benjamin Deeble, under and by virtue of certain Deeds conveying to said Deeble the interests of the aforesaid Baron Worth in certain parts of the lands now known by the name of Knockica, said Baron Worth having been the owner of said Tithes with the lands by Royal Patent.

And I do further certify that the average price of wheat during the seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 (Thirty) is one Pound Twelve Shillings and one halppenny q Barrel; and that the price of Oats during the same period is Twelve Shillings & Eleven pence halppenny q Barrel. wheat and Oats being the Corn principally grown in said County of Cork. Dated this Twenty seventh day of October 1834 (Thirty four)
