We Jonathan David Clarke of the City of Dublin and Charles Farran of Fishin Castle in the County of Dublin Esquires Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Kinsaley in the County of Dublin do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Twenty four Pounds and 16 s. by the year of which sum of Two Hundred and Twenty four Pounds and 16 s. two Third Parts are due & payable to the Rev. Stewart Logan French as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector and Vicar of the said Parish and one Third Part is due and payable to him as Lessee of the Very Rev. the Dean and Chapter of Saint. Patrick's Cathedral for the Tithes of Drinan Feltram Rathalke and Maleskown in the said Parish of Kinsaley and we do further certify that the average Price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in said County for the Period of Seven years ending on the 1st day of November 1821. is 18. 1/2 per Barrel. and we do further certify that the above mentioned Composition is to continue unvaried for and during the Term of 21 years from the date hereof without any respect to the average Price of Corn pursuant to the resolution of a special Vestry duly called and held in Swords on the 4th Septem^r 1824.
