Henry Shaw, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the Reign of King William the Fourth entitled, An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielding or payable within the Parish of Stiltogary in the County of Dublin. do hereby certify that the true and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is One hundred and Sixty One Pounds nine shillings and four pence Halfpenny by the Year, which sum of £161. 9 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> is due and payable to the very Reverend the Dean and Chapter of Saint Patrick's Cathedral in their Corporate Capacity, or to their Successors.

And do further certify that the average price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period seven years ending on the Thirty first day of October One thousand Eight hundred and Thirty is One Pound twelve shillings and one Halfpenny per Barrel
