Observations

The very great Subdivision of Land in Faranshombes made it necessary for the Commissioners in some Cases (to avoid the great Expense of Surveying) to put several small Lots into One & with the Consent of the Proprietors a their Agent to put down the entire Ground to One Person who will arrange with the Undertenants for their respective Proportions. Thus in Page 2. N^o 21. M^r Spud the Proprietor is put down for 1. 2. 0 which is occupied by 13 Undertenants and in N^o 26. 27. 28 (same Page) M^r Foster & M^r Nash & M^r Evans are put down for the ground occupied by their Undertenants, M^r Foster having 23 Tenants M^r Nash 6 Tenants all residing on One acre, & M^r Evans in like manner.

As there are Instances where the same Person holds different Farms in the same Townland either under One or different Proprietors, also where the same Person holds farms in different Townlands, it is considered advisable to point out when they occur in the foregoing Appendix.

In Page 3. Townland Faranshombes N^o 29 M^r Nash Daley holds different Farms containing in the whole 29. 2. 39. Of this we have classed 11. 3. 1 in the 2^d Class being the divisions contiguous to his Dwelling House. We have classed in the
