town of Galway Esq^s Commissioners duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made
in the fourth Year of the reign of King George the fourth
intituled an Act to provide for the establishing of
composition for tithes in Ireland for a limited time,
and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for tithes arising growing yielded or payable within
the Parish of Saint Nicholas in the County of the
town of Galway. Do hereby Certify that the true and
just amount of composition for all tithes whatever
within the said Parish of Saint Nicholas is One Hundred
and Ninety Pounds Sterling by the Year due and payable
to the very Reverend James Daly Warden of Galway and
his Successors, for the time and space of Twenty one Years
commencing on the first of May One Thousand eight
Hundred and twenty seven. And we do further certify
that the average price of Oats being the Corn principally
grown in such County for the period of seven Years
ending on the first of November One Thousand eight
Hundred and Twenty one is ten Shillings and six pence
by the Barrel. Dated this first day of March One
Thousand eight Hundred and Twenty seven
