parish of Santry in the County of Dublin do hereby Certify
that the true and just amount of composition for all Tythe
£462⁰0⁰ whatever within the said parish is four hundred and sixty two
pounds by the Year of the present currency of the United Kingdom
of Great Britain and Ireland of which sum of four hundred
and sixty two pounds there is due and payable to the Reverend
Denis Browne as a Composition for the Tythe claimable by him
as Vicar of the said parish so much thereof as shall be hereafter
apportioned by us pursuant to said Acts and made payable out of the
Lands of ¹Stormanstown ²Maigeston otherwise Meakestown ³Lillock
⁴Darkeston ⁵Huntstown ⁶Ballystrawan ⁷⁻⁸the two Clonsaghs ⁹Cottinstown
¹⁰Davinstown and ¹¹Bullymon in said parish as the Tythes whereof
were granted for the use and benefit of the Incumbent of said
parish
