

Tithe Composition

I Joseph Henry Mybrants having been duly appointed and sworn as Commissioner under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time and by virtue of an Act passed in the second and third years of the reign of his Majesty King William the Fourth entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes whatever arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Ballyscullogue otherwise Portland in the county of Kildare do certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is fifty eight Pounds eighteen Shillings and eleven pence

by the year of which sum of £ 58. 18. 11 are due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Charles Caulfield as Rector of said Parish

And I do further certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years ending the first day of November 1830 is Thirty two Shillings and one half penny by the Barrel.
