

We Edward Langford and Charles M. Donnell
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and
by Virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the
Reign of King George the Fourth entitled "An Act to
provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time", to ascertain and fix
a true and just composition for all Tithes, arising,
growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of
Shanagolden and County of Limerick. We hereby
Certify that the true and just amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is
Two hundred pounds by the Year of which sum of
Two hundred pounds the One third part thereof being
Sixty six pounds thirteen shillings and four pence, is
due and payable to the Rev^d George Vincent as a
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar of
the said Parish. And the remaining two thirds being a
sum of One hundred and thirty three pounds six shillings
and eight pence, is due and payable to the Rev^d John Warburton
as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Vicar
of the Rectorial Tithes of said Parish.

And we do further Certify that the average
price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in
said County for the period of Seven Years ending on the
first day of November One thousand eight hundred
and twenty One, is One pound eighteen shillings and
eight pence half penny, late Currency by the Barrel.
