

Mr. Mather, Mr. Dunnett of Duffad in the County of Antrim
Cornelius Keogh of St. James, Wex in the County of Sligo, Commissioners
by appointment and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth
year of the Reign of King George the fourth, entitled an Act to provide for
the establishment of Compositions for tithes in Ireland, for a limited
time; and also of an Act made in the fifth year of the Reign of King
George the fourth, entitled an Act to amend an Act of the last Session of
Parliament, for providing for the establishing of compositions for tithes
in Ireland, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all
tithes, arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Shanaw
in the County of Sligo, Do hereby certify that, the true and just amount
of Composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is Thirty
Six pounds by the year; of which sum of Thirty Six pounds, one half
is due and payable to the Reverend Mather J. Shaw, the Vicar of said
Parish; and the remaining half is due and payable to Alexander
Percival Esq., or his tenant Mr. John Wilson, as lay Impropriator.

And we have fixed on the said sum of Thirty Six pounds,
being the amount of the agreement unanimously entered into between the
Proprietors of tithes and the Special Vestry, to continue without
alteration, with respect to the Value of Corn or otherwise, for the term
of Twenty One Years, from the first day of November One Thousand
Eight Hundred and Twenty Four 1824, and which Vestry was held at
Ummeyra Coe in the Parish of Shanaw on the thirteenth day of
October instant.
