of Shan Kille in the County of Roscommon Do hereby Certify that  
the true and Just amount of Composition for all the Tythes &  
whatsoever within the said parish is One hundred pounds by the  
Year of which sum of One hundred pounds One Half is due and  
payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Oliver Curry as a Composition for the tythes &  
claimable by him as Vicar of said parish and the other  
Half is payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> Richard Wynne as owner of the  
Rectorial Tythes

And we do further Certify that the average price of Wheat  
being the <sup>corn</sup> principally grown in such County for the period of Seven  
Years ending on the first day of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1821 is Ten Shillings and Six  
pence for Barrel
