Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an
Act made in the Fourth Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth
(intituled an Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland for a limited time) to ascertain and fix a true and just
Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable
within the Parish of Shanlis in the County of Louth; Do hereby
Certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes
£12.10.0 whatever within the Said Parish is Eighty two pounds ten shillings
by the Year, an due and payable to the Right Honble Lord Ferrard
as Lay Impropriator of all Tithes of Said Parish of Shanlis

And we do further Certify that
the average price of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in
Said County for the period of seven Years ending the First of
£18.3 $\frac{1}{2}$ November 1821 is one pound eighteen shillings and eight pence halfpenny
late Currency, equal to £1.15.8 $\frac{3}{4}$ present Currency per barrel.
