and Sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign
of King George the fourth entitled "an Act to provide for the establishment of Compositions
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to Ascertain and fix a true and Just
Composition for all Tithes arising growing and yielded or payable within the
Parish of Shrule in the County of Longford do hereby Certify that the true and
Just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is
Three Hundred and eighteen pounds Six Shillings and seven pence Sterling by
the year of which Sum of Three Hundred and eighteen pounds Six Shillings and
seven pence One Hundred and Ninety four Pounds ten Shillings and four pence
halfpenny are due and payable to the vicars Choral of Christs Church and
S. Patricks Dublin as a Composition for the Tithe Claimable by them as owners
of the Rectorial Tithe And the Sum of One Hundred and twenty three pounds
Sixteen Shillings and two pence halfpenny are due and payable to the
Rev. Francis McQuire the vicar of said parish Said Sums to be paid by
two equal Half yearly payments in every year during the period of
Twenty one years the first payment thereof to be made on the first Day of
May in the year of Our Lord 1827 seven And we do further Certify that
the average price of oats being the Corn principally growing in such County for the
period of Seven years ending on the first Day of November 1821 one is Fifteen
Shillings and two pence halfpenny per Barrel
