

We, John Golding and Boscawen, Commissioners duly appointed  
and sworn, under and by Virtue of an Act, made in the fourth Year  
of the Reign of King George the Fourth, Intituled "An Act to provide for the  
Establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited Time",  
to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising  
growing, yielding or payable within the Parish of Shrule in the County of  
Meath, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Compo-  
sition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish is,

Two Hundred and Sixty Five Pounds, Eleven Shillings, & five Pence  
by the Year; of which sum of Two Hundred & Sixty five Pounds,  
Eleven Shillings & five Pence, three fourth parts are due and payable  
to the Very Revd. James Daly, Warden of Salway, as a Compo-  
sition for the Tithes claimable by him, as Rector of the said  
Parish; One fourth Part payable to the Revd. Richard  
Mansley, the Vicar of said Parish; and we do further  
certify that the average Prices of Wheat and Oats for  
the Period of Seven Years, ending on the first day of  
November 1821, is One Pound Eighteen Shillings and  
Eight Pence halpenny per Barrel for Wheat; and that  
the average Price of Oats is fifteen Shillings & Two  
Pence farthing, per Barrel for the same Period: they  
being the Corn chiefly grown in such County.
