duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the
fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intituled "An Act
to provide for the establishment of compositions for Tithes in Ireland
for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just composition
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the parish
of Syddan in the County of Meath do hereby certify that the
true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatsoever
within the said Parish is three hundred and sixty five pounds by the
year, of which sum of three hundred and sixty five pounds, eighteen
seventy third parts are due and payable to the Rev. Baron William
Dermot as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as ^{the Vicar of the}
said Parish, and fifty five seventy third parts are due and payable
to John Epton Esquire as owner of the Rectorial Tithes of the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the above eighteen seventy third parts
amount to the sum of ninety pounds, and that the aforesaid fifty
five seventy third parts amount to the sum of two hundred and seventy
five pounds -

And we do further certify that the average price of Oats, being
the corn principally grown in such county for the period of seven years
ending the first of November 1821 is fifteen shillings & two pence half penny
per barrel.
