Act passed in the fifth year of the Reign of King George
the fourth, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within
the Parish of Spink in the Queens County Do Certify
that the true and just amount of Composition for all
Tithes whatsover within the said Parish is One Hundred
and Thirty five Pounds stg by the year, the entire
£135 of which sum is now due and payable to the Rev.
Alexander Staples Clerk, as Lessee of the Corporation
of Kilkenny and as Vicar of s^d. Parish, and that the
the said Alexander Staples will so continue until
to the entire of said sum until the twenty fifth Day
1832 March one thousand eight hundred and Thirty
thousand eight hundred and Thirty two
third parts of said sum of One hundred and thirty
five Pounds will be due and payable to The Lord
Mayor and Corporation for the time being of the
City of Kilkenny as a Composition for the Tithes
claimable by them as Lay Impropriators of
Parish, and the remaining one third part thereof
is to be due and payable to the said Rev.
Alexander Staples as the Vicar as afores^d. of

remain and continue Invariable for the
