

We Whitten Wilson and Richard Ryan Commissioners duly  
appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in  
fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth intituled  
"An Act to provide for the establishing of compositions for  
tithes in Ireland for a limited time," to ascertain and fix a  
true and just composition for all tithes arising, growing, payable,  
or payable within the Parish of Shyngre in the County of Meath,  
do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition  
for all tithes whatever within the said parish is two hundred  
and eighty pounds by the year — Of which sum of two  
hundred and eighty pounds, the whole is due and payable  
to the Reverend Stephen Radcliffe as a composition for the  
tithe claimable by him as Rector of said parish —

And we do further certify that the average  
price of wheat, being the corn principally grown in  
such county, for the period of seven years ending on  
the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1826 is one pound eighteen shillings  
and eight pence halfpenny per Barrel estimated according  
to the late currency of Ireland — Dated this 27<sup>th</sup> day  
of March 1827 —
