We the undersigned John Scully and Richard Casphey Commissioners appointed under the tithes composition acts find the Parish of Lollohid-beg in the county of Tipperary to contain by our survey and valuation thereof one thousand three hundred and thirty eight acres and nine perches, Irish plantation measure. Of which we find that six hundred and sixteen acres, one rood and twenty seven perches, marked First quality and worth two pounds three shillings and four pence, late Irish currency, per acre, shall pay the sum of two shillings and two pence half penny per acre and so in proportion for woods and perches as a

composition for the tithes thereof. And we find that four hundred and thirty six acres and two roods, marked Second quality and worth one pound ten shillings per acre shall pay the sum of one shilling and eight pence per acre and so in proportion for woods and perches as a composition for the tithes thereof. And we find that two hundred and eighty five acres and twenty two perches, marked Third quality and worth one pound per acre shall pay the sum of one shilling and one penny per acre and so in proportion for woods and perches as a composition for the tithes thereof. And finally we find that the above mentioned sums payable out of the above mentioned quantity of land, makes the sum of one hundred and nineteen pounds twelve shillings and eleven pence late Irish currency, being the sum agreed on as a composition for the tithes of the said parish. All the above mentioned sums are in the late Irish currency and the surveys made in the Irish plantation measure. Given under our hands and seals this 26th October 1726
